Pentecost is on May 19 this year. That's the day we celebrate the birth of the Church as outlined in Acts 2. It's traditional to wear red on that Sunday symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit.

This year we're doing something a little different.
In the early Church, there were three times of 40 periods of prayer preparing for a major event. One was Advent, which originally began on the evening of November 15 and lasted until the evening of December 24. Advent was six weeks until it was shortened to our modern four weeks.

The second time was Lent -the forty days (excluding Sundays) between Ash Wednesday and Easter.
The third period of forty days began on Pentecost Sunday and lasted for the following forty days. This was a time of prayer and seeking the power of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the Church and individual Christians.

When I first started going to church, Ordinary Time (the period following Pentecost until the First Sunday of Advent) was divided in half. The first half (basically the summer weeks) was Pentecost with the liturgical color of red, and the second half (the weeks of Autumn) was called Kingdomtide and used the liturgical color of green).

The Scripture readings for Pentecost focused on the work of the Spirit while those for Kingdomtide focused on the Kingdom, which isn't heaven when we die, but this world transformed to be God's Realm. The theme built up until Christ the King, which is the Sunday before Advent begins.

When our worship was revised, it was decided to move away from those seasons and call it the Season after Pentecost with green being the liturgical color. The Scripture readings still retain this two-pronged focus.

Why is all of this important?
This year, I'm asking us to keep this two-part focus of the Holy Spirit and the Kingdom. We will continue to use the red parament and altar cloths (excluding May 26, when they will be white in honor of Trinity Sunday), and we will focus on the Holy Spirit beginning with retaining a 40-Day period of prayer from May 19 onward. As Autumn kicks off, we will change to green (which symbolizes growth) and pray and focus on what it means to be part of the Church, which is helping to bring God's Kingdom "on earth as it is in heaven."

I hope this will help us as we move ahead to be part of what I like to call United Methodist 2.0 (more on that later) as we continue our mission to "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

Here is a prayer for the first half of this Season after Pentecost I hope we'll pray every day (in addition to the Breakthrough Prayer):

Almighty and most merciful God, grant that by the indwelling of your Holy Spirit we may be enlightened and strengthened for your service; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.<br>--The Book of Common Prayer<br>Peace and Good!<br>Tim

Cross $\sim$ Wind has a unique opportunity. We are providing space for the Haitian Assimilation Service. This project is run by Jonas Bonneval, who is from Haiti and works at the Logansport Intermediate School to help Haitian students.

On Saturday mornings from 10:00 to 12:00 and Sunday afternoons from 4:00-6:00 Jonas is helping Haitian adults learn English, learn how to fill out employment and other forms, and generally assimilate into the Logansport community.

This is an excellent program and a fantastic opportunity for our church to build bridges to the Haitian people who are trying to build a new life in America in general and in Logansport specifically.

We are looking for ways to further build those bridges.
This is one example of how God is answering our Breakthrough Prayer.
